International Relations scholar with a PhD from the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE). My research examines how security, identity, legitimacy, and political order are made, negotiated, and sustained through political practice. My work on Taiwan and Global China draws on multilingual fieldwork across East Asia and the wider Global South, including sustained research in South Sudan. Across connected research programmes on relational security and political identity, I trace how claims about security, belonging, and legitimate order acquire force through relationships, institutions, language, memory, and everyday practice.

Research areas: relational security; political order; Global China; Taiwan Studies; transitional justice; identity and belonging; development and peace; diplomacy; qualitative, multilingual, and fieldwork-based methods.
